Research, Teaching, Consulting, Events

Achim Schmitz continued in 2011 (together with an external colleague) a three-year evaluation on the project „Fair Understanding – Intercultural and social competencies in school and vocational training“ for *Act for transformation*.

He also just concluded a study financed by the Rosa Luxemburg Foundation on the protest movement against the new railway station in Stuttgart. Subject of that study are practices that civil society uses to achieve “more democracy”, more nonviolent conflict transformation and more solidarity in society.

In Stuttgart he taught communications at the *Studium Generale* (courses open for the general public) of the University of Stuttgart and at the *Ludwig Schlaich Akademie* in Waiblingen.

Christine Schweitzer spent most of her time in 2011 as Interim Program Director of the INGO *Nonviolent Peaceforce*. Aside of that, she conducted an evaluation of the training work of the *Center for Nonviolent Action* (CNA) Sarajevo / Belgrade and gave various presentations at conferences. Another focus has been the continued work as an editor of the magazine *Peace Forum*, with major topics being „Conscious Objection International”, “Caucasus“ and “War and Peace in the Literature”.

Study Days

In spring 2011 the IFGK did not hold a study day of its own but instead invited all members and supporters to the annual conference of the Federation for Social Defence in Minden.

On the 15th October 2011 the IFGK organized a Study Day in Cologne on the topic of “Gütekraft” (Truth Force). A report (in German language) can be found soon on www.guetekraft.net.

Christine Schweitzer represents the IFGK at the *Plattform Zivile Konfliktbearbeitung* and at the *War Resisters' International (WRI)*.

Several members participated at the annual conference and assembly of the *Federation for Social Defence (BSV)*.
